

Azadeh Tabazadeh

Dr. Tabazadeh work experience has been primarily focused on scientific research where she worked with large group of scientists and engineers to unravel the mysteries of the Earth's atmosphere dealing with global environmental crises. Her work experience includes teaching at Stanford, and being a senior research scientist in NASA Ames Research Center.

Dr. Tabazadeh discoveries have been recognized and awarded by major national scientific organizations, including the American Geophysical Union, the American Meteorological Society, the American Institute of Physics and NASA as well as the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy.

In 2005 the TIME Innovator Series published an article about Dr. Tabazadeh --under the heading of The Sky Detective-- highlighting her scientific discoveries as well as personal journey. After the article was published, to her surprise, she received many "fan" letters and emails encouraging her to write about her life, which led Azadeh to begin writing her memoirs. A collection of her memoirs, titled: The Sky Detective, is now available for purchase on Amazon and at Barnes and Noble.

The Sky Detective is a debut memoir about her childhood and adolescent years in Iran. Azadeh fled Iran in 1982, two years after the Iraq invasion of Iran, to pursue her dream of becoming a scientist. In 1994 she graduated with a doctoral degree in chemistry from UCLA. Since then, she has worked at NASA, taught at Stanford University, and has published over sixty scientific articles.

Currently, Dr. Tabazadeh is an environmental consultant and an author, living in Mountain View, CA.
